# IN THE DARK? There's an APP for That

Our text this Sunday is John 9:1-12 with Jesus encountering a blind man. Blindness was much more common in the ancient world, with no cures available. This fact, along with its symbolic nature, explains the sheer number of Biblical stories about blindness. This particular man, John tells us, has been blind from birth, which leads the disciples into a theological discussion about the origin of the man's suffering. They assume that there must be a connection between this man's suffering and either his own sin or the sin of his parents. Does this passage leave you in the dark about how God works? Join us this Sunday at 10am to learn the deeper truth in this passage and experience God's love and light in the midst of our darkness.

#### Moments for Mission August 25, 2024

The Mission Committee of St Paul Lutheran Church recently met for discussion and distribution of mission funds for the 2 nd Quarter of 2024.

The Olympic Games have created a lot of enjoyment recently for millions of Americans and others around the world. This world sporting event brought memories of a Christian organization which was founded in 1954 and continues to this day to support athletics, teams and coaches, the **Fellowship of Christian Athletics**. This interdenominational Christian sports ministry has at its mission to see the world impacted for Jesus Christ through the influence of coaches and athletes. The Mission Committee designated the amount of \$757.66 to Fellowship of Christian Athletic USA. These funds will assist programs within the FCA to continue to seek to make disciples through their strategy of engaging, equipping and empowering coaches and athletes to know and grow in Christ. The international portion of this quarter's mission funds resulted in a bit of investigation. The LCMC website noted the importance of the faith-based organization Marion Medical Mission. St. Paul will be sending this international organization \$757.66 for use "where the need is greatest." MMM is the abbreviation for the **Marion Medical Mission**, which finds its headquarters in Marion, Illinois. MMM's mission is to share the love of Jesus by providing safe, clean, sustainable sources of drinking water to the extreme poor in sub-Saharan Africa. This work sharing the hands of God began in 1985 and more information is available at their website mmwater.org. Their logo notes Christ's Love, Clean Water, and Community! This is the first time Marion Medical Mission has received mission funds from St. Paul Lutheran Church. Praise God for keeping the lights on, being blessed daily and being able to bless others in the name of Jesus Christ.
